**CHAPTER 7 – FLORIDA WING CADET HONOR SOCIETY**

**7-1. Introduction.**

- a. Purpose.** The purpose of the Florida Wing Cadet Honor Society is to assist cadets gain academic recognition and credit for educational and scholarship purposes. It is a great achievement to be recorded on high school or college resumes, and squadrons are highly encouraged to promote this in their cadet programs.
- b. History.** The Florida Wing Cadet Honor Society was created in 1998 as part of the vision of then Chief of Staff, Lt Col Matthew Sharkey (Later Florida Wing, then Southeast Region Commander). Lt Col Sharkey envisioned an honor that would recognize the academic excellence of cadets who excel above their peers.
- c. Authority.** The authority to exercise and execute the Florida Wing Cadet Honor Society shall remain with the Wing Commander through the Director of Cadet Programs and/or the Cadet Honor Society Senior Administrator.

**7-2. Criteria.** Florida Wing Cadet Honor Society criteria shall be as follows:

- a. Initial Induction.** Cadets applying for initial induction into the Cadet Honor Society shall:
  - (1) Score a 90% or above per achievement or milestone, which will be the average of both Aerospace and Leadership tests for Achievements 2 through 7.  
*Note: Achievement 1 and milestone tests will stand by themselves and only the leadership tests will be used for achievements 8 through 16. Aerospace Education tests for Achievements 8-16 are open book and will not be counted.*
  - (2) Maintain this average over a consecutive three-achievement/milestone span, with no time frame.
  - (3) The score will be calculated based on the first attempt of the test.
  - (4) The cadet will be a member in good standing.
- b. Society Members of Distinction.** Cadets applying for Society Member of Distinction shall:
  - (1) Have been inducted into the Cadet Honor Society.
  - (2) Score a 90% or above per achievement or milestone, which will be the average of both Aerospace and Leadership tests for Achievements 4 through 7. Test scores used for initial induction will not be used.  
*Note: Milestone tests will stand by themselves and only the leadership tests will be used for achievements 8 through 16. Aerospace Education tests for Achievements 8-16 are open book and will not be counted.*
  - (3) Maintain this average over a consecutive three-achievement/milestone span, with no time frame.
  - (4) The score will be calculated based on the first attempt of the test.
  - (5) The cadet will be a member in good standing.

**7-3. Program Management.**

- a. Squadron Level.** The cadet's squadron testing officer and squadron commander (or deputy commander for cadets) shall verify that the criterion set forth has been met prior to submitting an application for induction.
- b. Wing Level.** The Director of Cadet Programs shall appoint a Cadet Honor Society Senior Administrator. The senior administrator's role shall include the tracking of all inductees and administering of awards and correspondence.

**7-4. Application Procedures.** The squadron commander (or deputy commander for cadets) shall submit a completed and signed FLWG Form 501, *Cadet Honor Society Inductee Application* (See attachment 1) to:

Society Member of Distinction applicants should indicate that they are a current Cadet Honor Society member as a notation in the Unit Certification section of the application.

**7-5. Awards and Decorations.** Cadets inducted into the Cadet Honor Society shall be awarded:


**a. Initial Inductees.**

- (1) A blue and gold shoulder cord
- (2) FLWG Certificate 210, *Florida Wing Cadet Honor Society Induction Certificate* (see attachment 2)
- (3) The cadet's name will be listed as an inductee on the Florida Wing Cadet Programs website.

**b. Society Members of Distinction.**

- (1) A blue and gold aiguillettes with nickel tip which shall replace the wearing of the blue and gold shoulder cord.
- (2) FLWG Certificate 211, *Florida Wing Cadet Honor Society Member of Distinction* (see attachment 3)
- (3) The cadet's name will display an asterisk on the Florida Wing Cadet Programs website noting the second achievement.

**7-6. Limitations.** Cadets will be recognized for scholastic achievement by the Cadet Honor Society for no more than two times as outlined in Chapter 7 of CAPR 52-16, Supplement 1.
